Question: Under the Statement of Work section, 3.2, the ITB states that Nessus, Foundstone, and WebInspect are to be used for network analysis. If my company uses proprietary software that matches the functionality of the solutions stated above, would this be acceptable for this project? Our solutions accomplish all of the technical capabilities of these solutions, and are Top-Rated by Gartner's research findings.

Response: *The City will consider "approved equal" software/applications for those brand names used in the Invitation to Bid. The software offered must be equal in quality and standards of performance to the software specified in the Solicitation. The Bid Submittal must be accompanied by complete technical specifications and performance information on the software being offered as an equal. Any software offered as an equal that does not include sufficient information in the Bid for the City to evaluate, will not be accepted. The City shall be sole judge of equality, based on the best interests of the City, and its decision in this regard shall be final.*

All other terms, covenants and conditions of the subject solicitation and any addenda issued thereto shall apply, except to the extent herein amended.
